Our Mission

The Ian James Wallace Scholarship Fund was established to perpetuate Ian's message and the example he set for all of us.

Eligibility Guidelines:

- Recipients of the Scholarship will demonstrate and be committed to excellence in the Arts and Humanities;
- Is a Colorado high school graduate entering college as a freshman;
- Provides a copy of the most current transcript showing an accumulative grade point average of 3.0 or better (unweighted) through the first semester of the student's senior year;
- Scholarship funds will be earmarked only for the student's first year of college;
- Scholarship checks will be sent to the institution in which the award recipient is enrolled full-time for the 2008-2009 academic school year.

The Ian James Wallace Scholarship fund will award a minimum of two scholarships (\$1,500 each) for post-secondary education in recognition of one Smoky Hill High School senior and one graduating senior from the state of Colorado who intend to pursue a major in the Arts and Humanities. The senior must exhibit advancement in personal growth and development in one or more of the following areas: community contributions, academic success and personal accomplishments. *Community contributions* include community service projects, co-curricular activities, athletics and sportsmanship. *Academic success* includes improvement in GPA between freshman and senior years, raising and achieving academic goals. *Personal accomplishments* (in or out of school) include the arts, music, theatre, technology, consumer/family studies, science, athletics, volunteer work, etc. **Please contact your counselor if you are uncertain whether or not your submission qualifies for scholarship consideration.**

- Include a copy of a letter documenting acceptance to a post-high school education program for the fall of 2008. *If this document is not available by the February 15, 2008 deadline date, a copy must be eventually provided in order to receive scholarship money.*
